ABOUT JACKSONVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1883, Jacksonville State
University, also known as Jax State, is
a learning-centered comprehensive public
university in Jacksonville, Alabama, committed
to providing distinctive educational, cultural
and social experiences for a diverse student
population.

Nestled in the Appalachian foothills of northeast Alabama, midway between Birmingham and Atlanta, Jax State is home to nearly 10,000 students from more than 60 countries. As a learning-centered university, it strives to challenge students academically in a responsive environment and supports them in achieving their educational, career and personal goals. As an institution of higher





learning, it seeks to produce broadly educated graduates prepared for global engagement while promoting scholarly research and service activities that align with its academic and professional strengths.

Jax State is recognized as a top-tier regional university, climbing steadily in the *U.S. News & World Report* Best Colleges Rankings over the past four years. It is ranked #55 among Best Regional Universities in the South and #25 among Best Public Universities in the South for 2025. The University is also a top producer of Fulbright Scholars, recognized by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Jax State, known as "the friendliest campus in the South," offers a diverse and comprehensive range of academic programs designed to prepare students for successful careers and lifelong learning. The University provides 46 undergraduate degree programs, 12 undergraduate microcredentials and certificates, 64 master's programs, three doctoral programs, seven Educational Specialist (EdS) programs and 15 graduate certificate programs and microcredentials. Many of these programs are available entirely online, offering flexibility to accommodate students' schedules and learning preferences. The University maintains a student-to-faculty ratio of 18:1, ensuring personalized instruction and mentorship in a supportive learning environment.

With one of the highest percentages of accredited programs among universities nationwide, Jax State is committed to academic excellence and student success. Reinforcing its dedication to high academic standards, Jax State received a 10-year reaffirmation of accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) in 2024. This distinction demonstrates the University's commitment to institutional integrity, academic quality and continuous improvement in higher education.

On June 23, 2020, **Dr. Don C. Killingsworth, Jr. was named the 13th president of Jax State** after serving as acting president for seven months. A two-time Jax State graduate, Dr. Killingsworth has dedicated his entire career to the University, previously holding leadership roles in student affairs, academic advisement and government relations. In addition to his role as president of the University, Dr. Killingsworth serves in leadership roles among his peers. He is president of the Council of Colleges and University Presidents and vice chair of the Conference USA (CUSA) Board of Directors.

Jax State boasts a vibrant and engaging student experience, offering more than 100 student organizations, cultural experiences and leadership opportunities. The University is home to the award-winning Marching Southerners and Ballerinas, a world-renowned marching band organization. It also hosts the International House Program, which fosters global cultural exchange by pairing American and international students to promote crosscultural understanding. Additionally, students can participate in competitive academic teams, esports and student government, providing diverse opportunities for involvement and personal development.



The Jacksonville State Gamecocks compete in 18 NCAA Division I sports, demonstrating a long-standing tradition of excellence and competitive success. Jax State joined Conference USA on July 1, 2023, elevating its football program to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), the highest level of college football. Since the transition, the Gamecocks have continued to build on their championship legacy, earning multiple conference titles, NCAA postseason appearances and national recognition across various sports.

On March 19, 2018, an EF-3 tornado caused more than \$100 million in damage to campus. The University community came together under the "Gamecock Strong" spirit to rebuild and revitalize its facilities. Since then, Jax State has made significant investments in campus restoration, creating state-of-the-art learning spaces and athletic venues.

Jax State has risen from the debris and is experiencing a transformational era with

major campus developments enhancing academic facilities, student life and athletics.

In Fall 2024, Jax State opened the North Village Housing Project, providing modern residential spaces designed to enhance student living, along with a new dining hall, offering expanded meal options in a dynamic, student-friendly setting. In athletics, the Loring and Debbie White Football Complex was completed in the summer of 2024, reinforcing the University's dedication to elevating its athletic programs. Meanwhile, construction began in 2024 on the Randy Owen Center for the Performing Arts. This state-of-the-art facility will serve as a hub for the arts along the West Village Residence Housing Project. This dynamic facility will replace outdated housing on campus and provide students with an unparalleled place to connect, collaborate and grow.

This period of progress and growth continues into the future, as Jax State remains committed to expanding opportunities and advancing its mission. In February 2025, the University launched its most ambitious fundraising effort to date—"It's A Jax State of Mind," a historic \$100 million comprehensive campaign designed to support scholarships, academic programs, facility enhancements and student success initiatives. This transformative campaign ensures that Jax State will continue to evolve as a premier institution, providing cutting-edge resources, toptier facilities and unparalleled student experiences for generations to come. ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED ENGINEERING



The mission of the Department of Applied Engineering is to educate an undergraduate and graduate student body for successful careers in a dynamically changing global environment. Its programs are designed for those with an orientation towards the application of engineering and management concepts to solving complex real-world problems. The Department seeks to develop and maintain strong connections to industries in Northeast Alabama, for the mutual benefit of enhanced economic vitality to the region.

The Department prioritizes excellence through small classes taught by faculty (not graduate students), high faculty-student interaction and an emphasis on the industrial application of engineering theory.

In Fall 2024, six faculty and two staff supported 272 students in five Bachelor of Science Programs and 12 students in one Master of Science program. A 4+1 MBA program allows applied engineering undergraduates to seamlessly transition into the Master of Business Administration - General Concentration program. Also the Department works in collaboration with the JSU Center for Manufacutering Support and its four staff members.

All undergraduate programs as well as the graduate program are accredited by ATMAE: The Association of Technology, Management and Applied Engineering.

ABOUT THE POSITION

Jacksonville State University invites applications and nominations for the position of Department Head of Applied Engineering beginning August 1, 2025.

The Department Head of Applied Engineering is the educational and chief administrator responsible for the Department and reports directly to the Dean of the College, who is responsible to the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs for the successful management of the Department. The Department Head provides vision, leadership, direction, and expert administration and ensures the participation of faculty in teaching, research, publication and community service.

The Department Head may be required to teach courses within his/her concentration area on campus, off-campus, online and possibly via videoconferencing depending on need of location.



ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lead Departmental growth with respect to students, faculty, programs, resources and academic quality
- Manage the Department's resources in consultation with the Dean
- Manage and administer programmatic accreditations with ATMAE and eventually ABET
- Provide advisement and collaboration on projects with the JSU Center for Manufacturing Support
- Foster a Departmental culture of discovery, innovation and collegiality
- Encourage faculty in areas related to pedagogical improvement and professional development, including scholarly work and applied research and other internally or externally funded activities
- Monitor student enrollment numbers and work with Enrollment Management to extend, expand and ensure Departmental participation in recruitment efforts appropriate to the programs
- Develop and expand relationships with industry partners to increase opportunities for faculty professional development, applied research, work-based learning opportunities for students and educational partnerships for regional employers
- · Perform other duties as assigned

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- An earned doctorate in industrial engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, occupational safety or a closely related field
- A minimum of one year of experience in a manufacturing or similar field
- A minimum of one year of administrative experience such as department head, assistant department head, director, assistant director, program leader/coordinator or similar responsibility
- Accomplishments and credentials sufficient to meet the requirements of the rank of Associate Professor or Professor at JSU in teaching, service and scholarly publications, which includes a minimum of five years of experience in higher education

Nestled in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains in Northeast Alabama,

Jacksonville is a charming small southern town with a historical past and promising future.

Once a centerpiece in the American Civil War, Jacksonville is the epitome of peaceful, small-town life today, complete with a friendly, family-oriented atmosphere, beautiful historic churches, restored antebellum homes, unique Public Square and safe, attractive neighborhoods. The city offers its 12,500 residents low cost of living, excellent education and healthcare, abundant natural resources and a plethora of cultural opportunities, including world-class museums

such as the Anniston Museum of Natural History and Berman Museum, historical sites, one-of-a-kind restaurants and specialty shops.

Historic structures grace Jacksonville, and many Civil War aficionados take particular interest in the city. One of the most sought-after attractions is the Gallant Pelham Statue and







grave located in Jacksonville City Cemetery. Additionally, the Jacksonville Train Depot in Calhoun County was built in 1860 but not used until 1868 because of the Civil War. It was restored and reopened in 2010 as a multi-use community facility and resting place for outdoor cycling enthusiasts enjoying the Chief Ladiga Trail.

The area's vast natural beauty has made it a recreational haven. Surrounded by the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains & Talladega National Forest, Jacksonville offers breathtaking scenery, as well as numerous outdoor activities including hiking, swimming, hunting, fishing, camping and biking. It's also a birding paradise, with the North Alabama Birding Trail encompassing 50 viewing sites in 11 counties.

Jacksonville is located halfway between Birmingham and Atlanta near Interstate 20, providing easy access to major urban areas. Additionally, two federal highways (431, 78) and one state highway (21) run through the city, which is served by three airports: Anniston Regional in Anniston, Ala. (15 miles away); Birmingham-Shuttlesworth International in Birmingham, Ala. (60 miles away); and Hartsfield-Jackson International in Atlanta, Ga. (80 miles away).
